Avoid making a crucial mistake this holiday by advertising your travel plans on social media. In a few seconds, a status update can lead to weeks and months of heartache and repair if the wrong eyes read that post. There have also been reports that that opportunists can track down an address from a website posting within 60 seconds.
